## Friday Master Class - DNA and Family History

- The role of DNA in genealogy has grown over the past decade and will become more important to genealogists as tests become faster and cheaper and interpretations are improved. In this Master Class Ken Hunt will look at some definitions before delving into the types of tests available and the reasons for taking them. He will identify some tools to manage and organise the data that our testing delivers before, finally, discussing some real-life examples and narratives. DNA genealogy can, and often does, challenge family myths by opening avenues of investigation not previously suspected but, at the same time, it is an exciting and often revealing addition to our paper-based family tree research.
