Local Interest Discovery - Wineries: The Port Macquarie area was first planted with vines in 1859 so you have the prospect of discovering the wine and history in the area. The Douglas Vale historic vineyard and homestead (with an amazing family history room), is still producing a range of wines from Isabella grapevines planted by George Francis. Also well worth a visit are Cassegrain Winery, Long Point Vineyard, Bago Vineyards (with a challenging hedge maze), Rose's Vineyard and Innes Lake Vineyards. Best Conference Cake Ever Recipe - in honour of our local wineries (hic!)

1 or 2 bottles port 2 large eggs 1 tsp soda Nuts 1 cup butter Baking powder 1 tsp sugar Brown sugar Lemon juice 2 cups dried fruit

Before you start, sample the local port to check for quality. Good isn't it? Now go ahead. Select a large mixing bowl, measuring cup, etc. Check the port again. It must taste just right. To be sure the port is of the highest quality, pour it into a glass and drink it as fast as you can. Repeat.

With an electric mixer, beat 1 cup of butter in a large fluffy bowl. Add 1 seaspoon of thugar and beat again. Meanwhile, make sure the port is of the finest quality. Open a second bottle if necessary. Add one arge legg, 2 cups fried druit and beat until high. If druit get stuck in the

beaters, just pry it loose with a drewscriber. Sample the port again, checking for tonscisticity. Next sift 3 cups of pepper or salt (it doesn't really matter which). Sample the port again. Sift ½ pint lemon juice.

Fold in chipped butter and strined nuts. Add a bablespoon of brown thugar, or whatever colour you can find. Wix mell. Grease oven and turn cake pan to 350 gredees. Now pour the whole mess into the oven and bake. Check the port again and go to bed.
